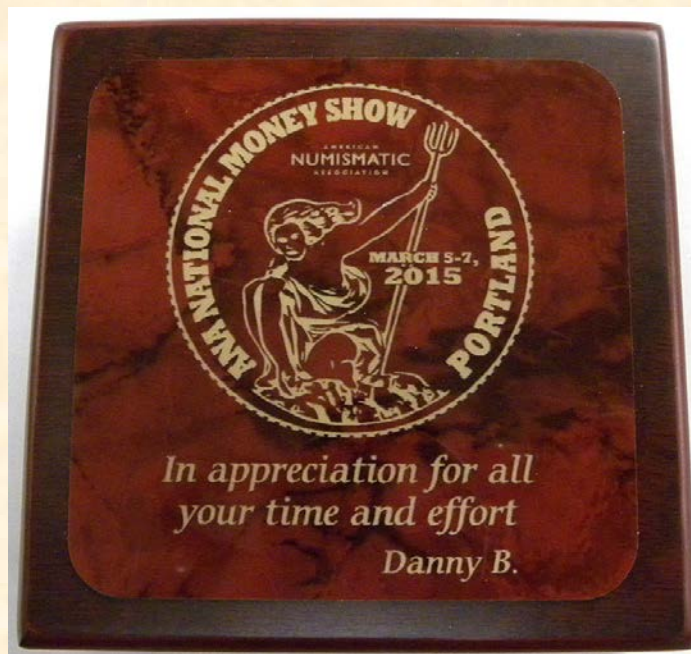

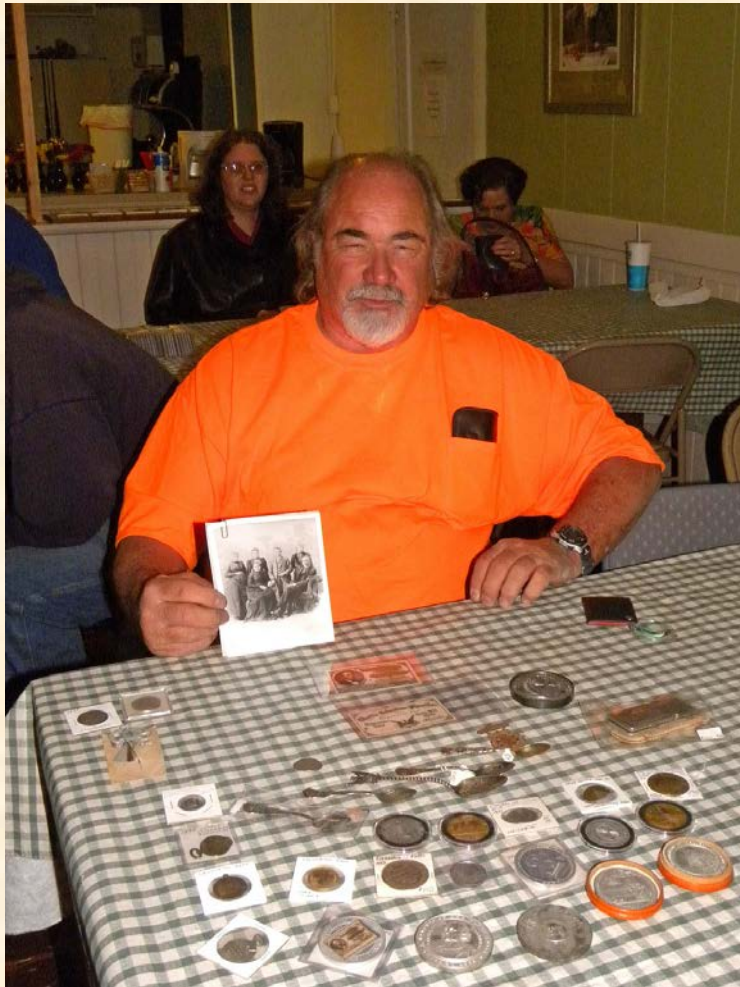

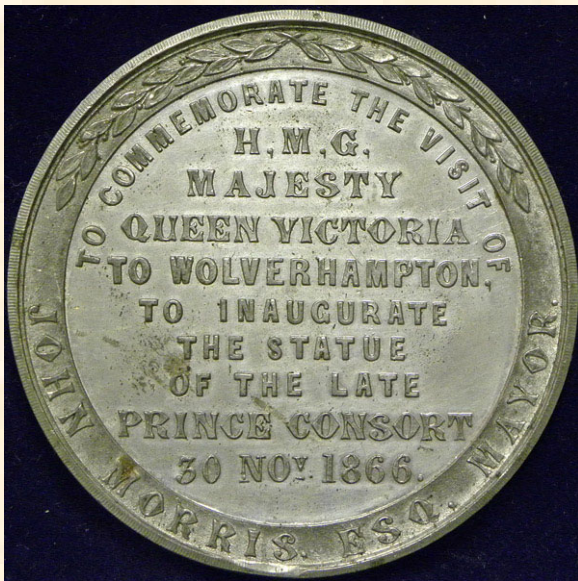

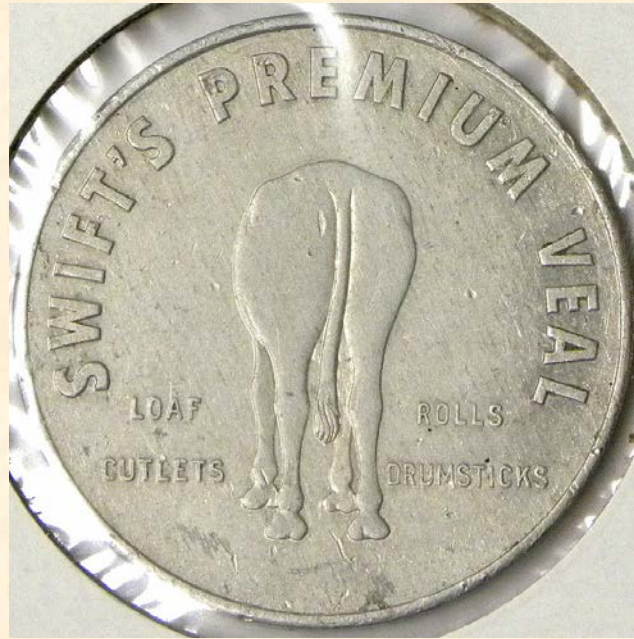

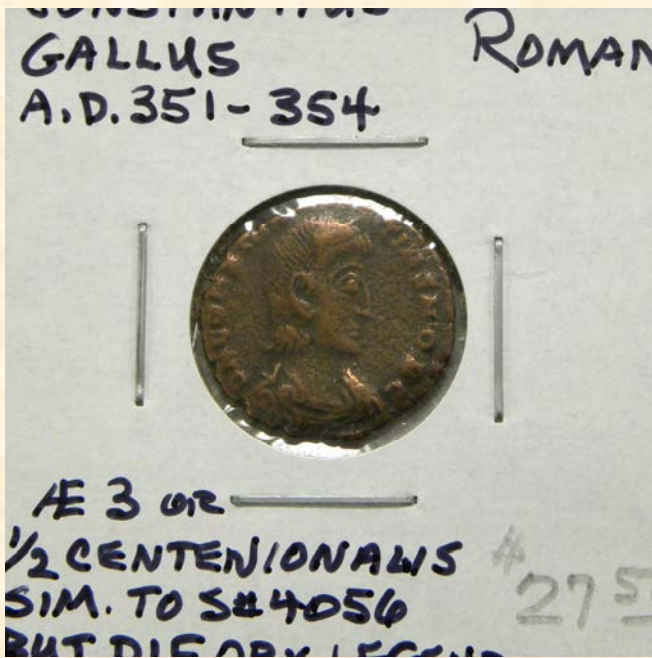

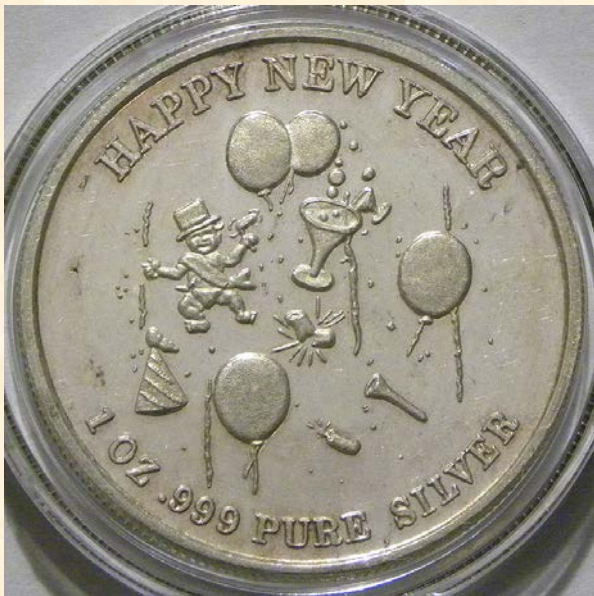

Apollo 11 Medals

Mission

July 16-24, 2019 marked the 50th anniversary of one of humankind's greatest achievements, the realization of the goal set forth by President Kennedy in May 1961 of "landing a man on the Moon and returning him safely to Earth" before the end of the decade. The culmination of over a decade of engineering development and flight tests, inspired by the dreams of pioneering rocket scientists, the Apollo 11 lunar landing briefly captured the public's attention worldwide like nothing else before. Although driven by the Cold War "space race" with the Soviet Union, the plaque left behind at the Sea of Tranquility reads "HERE MEN FROM THE PLANET EARTH FIRST SET FOOT UPON THE MOON JULY 1969, A.D. WE CAME IN PEACE FOR ALL MANKIND."

Numismatic Information

For over two millennia, individuals and nations have commemorated important events with medallary art. Apollo 11 ranks high on the list of the number of different commemorative issues. In 1969, the mission coincided with a period of rising popularity of private mints such as the Franklin Mint, and most Apollo 11 medals were struck by private mints for sale to the public and to collectors, although there are also medals struck for publicity, awards or other purposes. The medals are fun, educational, and a reasonable challenge to collect. You could build a set in a few weeks, or spend a lifetime. A few samples are shown here; see the PNNA website this fall for more information.
